

The Guidelines Committee (Martin Van den Bent, NL (chair), Matthias Preusser, AT (co-chair), Roland Goldbrunner, DE, Roger Henriksson, SE, Michael Jenkinson, UK, Emilie Le Rhun, CH, Giuseppe Minniti, IT, Alessia Pellerino, IT, (representative Youngsters Committee), Roberta Rudà, IT, Ghazaleh Tabatabai, DE, Michel Weller, CH, Patrick Wen, USA) continued also in 2021 with developing and updating guidelines in the field of neuro-oncology.

In 2021 several new and updated guidelines appeared. An important update of our key EANO guideline on glioma treatment appeared in press in Nature Reviews Clinical Oncology ("EANO guidelines on the diagnosis and treatment of diffuse gliomas of adulthood, $1^{\rm st}$ author Michael Weller).

In a joined effort with ESMO, an EANO-ESMO Clinical Practice Guidelines for diagnosis, treatment and follow-up of patients with brain metastasis from solid tumors was prepared which is now published in the Annals of Oncology (1st author Emilie Le Rhun).

A guideline prepared in a joined effort by EANO, EURACAN and SNO on intracranial germ cell tumors had its first electronic appearance in 2021, this effort was led by Didier Frappaz and reflect a true intercontinental guideline on this topic. The full paper version will be published in 2022 in Neuro-Oncology.

Meningioma are an important part of neuro-oncology, and in the diagnostics many changes are taking place. We are therefore proud on the EANO guideline on the diagnosis and management of meningiomas which also appeared in NeuroOncology this year (1st author Roland Godbrunner).

Ongoing efforts are on molecular diagnostics for routine diagnostics and targeted treatments, on primary CNS lymphoma, on rare neuroglial tumors, on complications of brain tumors and on systemic pharmacotherapy of brain tumors. EANO Diversity Statement

The EANO Disparity Committee has created a Diversity statement as EANO is aiming for a diverse and equal community that contributes to the aims of EANO, and a reversal of disparity that is harmful to professionals, patients and society.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- 3. Use our influence to promote equality and inclusion, highlight and support diversity in academic and educational initiatives in neuro-oncology
 - Promote diverse and representative conference programmes
 - · Promote diversity in educational delivery and content
 - Monitor and report diversity data to the academic community
- 4. Work with patient and stakeholder groups to promote equality in access to treatment and research
 - · Engage with research that addresses health inequalities in under-represented minorities
 - Provide advocacy for initiatives to reduce disparity in health care
 - Communicate relevant data to neuro oncology community




eEANO Webinar




Social Media
