## DISPARITY COMMITTEE

The Disparity Committee, under the leadership of Emilie LeRhun has monitored and ensured balanced representation of the faculty of the annual EANO Meeting in terms of diversity. Our representation data are something we are very proud of. The committee also provides input to the Executive Board on diversity topics and liaises with the diversity committees of other societies. In 2022 the committee has prepared an eEANO webinar on Work-Life balance and implemented a survey on “Positive action in neuro-oncology” to evaluate indicators that might potentially be useful to measure gender balance in neuro-oncology. This is currently in preparation for publication. 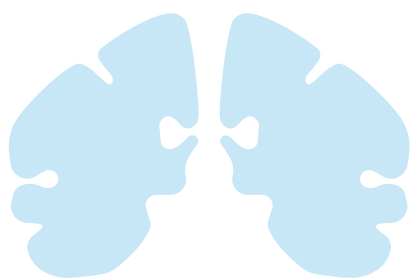
## NURSE & ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONAL COMMITTEE (NAC)

The group already has 72 members and aims to provide a platform for nurses and health care professionals in the field, enabling them to share questions, suggestions and discussion of topics relevant to neuro-oncology. # YOUNGSTERS COMMITTEE



The Youngsters Committee (Jan-Michael Werner, DE (chair); George Petrescu, RO (co-chair); Emilie Le Rhun, CH (Mentor Executive Board); Sharon Berendsen, NL; Francesco Bruno, IT; Barbara Kiesel, AT; Lauritz Miarka, DE; Maximillian Mair, AT; Andrada Turcas, RO and Iris Verploegh, NL) supports the Scientific Committee in developing the annual EANO Meeting programme with special focus on career development in Neuro-Oncology and topics relevant for the next generation of neuro-oncologists.

The year 2022 has been a very productive year for the EANO Youngsters committee.

The EANO Youngsters Track during the 16<sup>th</sup> EANO Conference in Vienna, September 15-18, 2022, was again one of the backbones of the Youngsters Committee's work. All sessions chaired by and designed for young colleagues were well attended. Starting with a first-time joint-session with the young EANS on "Second-line treatment in patients with recurrent glioblastoma", talks from invited speakers and outstanding abstracts led to an overcrowding "Künstlerzimmer" in Vienna. In our mentoring session "How to write a high impact paper" we were grateful to welcome outstanding mentors: G Zadeh (Canada), S Niclou (Luxembourg), U Harjes (Nature Medicine) and M Valiente (Madrid). The demand on this session led to a waiting list with over 150 persons. We will therefore extend the number of attendees for the Mentoring in 2023 (Rotterdam) without cutting down quality. During the well-attended EANO Youngsters session "Next generation low-grade glioma trials" we were happy to see a vital and active discussion and participation with the speakers and audience – an aspect that we will try to foster in upcoming meetings. The newly introduced "how to survive"-mentoring started with a successful session on "How to survive the immunotherapy talks". The good feedback from this session will encourage a continuation of this format in the next EANO meeting. The Youngsters' networking event was fully booked (120 tickets sold) and a success in connecting young colleagues from all over Europe and the world.

Together with the Diversity Committee, we held a well-attended webinar on work-life balance. The discussion on generation differences, gender differences and the role of EANO to improve work-life balance was lively.

The Educational Committee launched two new initiatives with the *EANO School of Neuro-Oncology* and the *Mentorship Programme* aiming to support the educational goals of young clinicians and researchers interested in the field of neuro-oncology. These programmes are presented separately in the annual report. The role of the Youngsters Committee is to make sure that these initiatives meet the necessities of the youngsters.

The call for six new members for the Committee resulted in 29 outstanding applications. Independent selection and objective rating by the active members of the Youngsters Committee based on the applicants' CV and project proposal resulted in an exciting new youngsters committee with an equal gender balance, clinicians and basic scientists, and geographic spread. The committee started its work after EANO 2022 in September. Chairing the newly formed committee will be J.-M. Werner (DE) with G. Petrescu (RO) as Co-Chair.

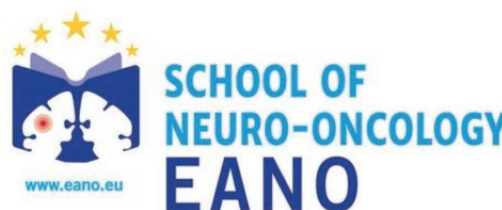

# EANO ACTIVITIES

## EANO School of Neuro-Oncology

EANO school of Neuro-Oncology was launched on October 9<sup>th</sup>, starting with the weekend on basic science and methodology chaired by M. Lorgier and S. Niclou.



Briefly, the school is designed as a two-year in-depth course in the field, taught virtually over seven weekends, each weekend involving 10 hours of teaching and concluding with a multiple-choice self evaluation test.

At the end of the two years there will be the option for a rotation through a center of excellence for a period of one to three months and a mandatory test on the material of all seven weekends, resulting in a certificate.

65 applicants were evaluated for the course and of those 15 were selected based on merit and likelihood to derive most benefit from the school. All attendees are early career physicians from different specialties involved in the field of Neuro-Oncology, and different countries in Europe.

The first weekend was a great success. The next weekend scheduled for early February will be on both high and low grade gliomas. Teaching by experts in the field will involve pathology & molecular biology, surgery, radiotherapy and systemic therapy, one day for high grade and one for low grade tumors. This weekend is chaired by Stephen Price, neurosurgeon and current chair of the educational committee of a EANO, Michael Weller & Martin Van Den Bent, both neuro-oncologists and past presidents of EANO.

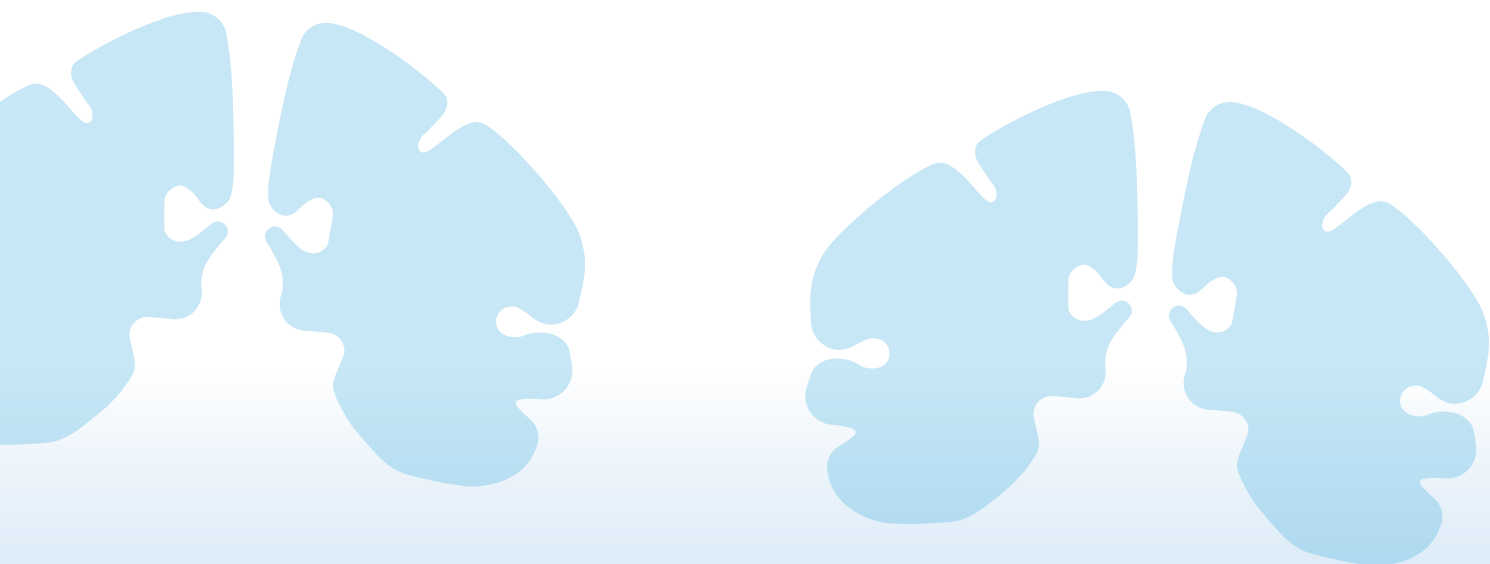
Upcoming topics are pediatric Neuro-Oncology, brain metastases, extra-axial tumors and CNS lymphoma, rare entities and hot clinical issues.

## EANO Mentorship Programme

The EANO scientific educational committee set up a program of one-to-one mentoring for a year.

A list of volunteer mentors from the EANO members was created, followed by a call for mentees. Each mentee had to be an EANO member and was allowed to propose the mentor of their preference from the list. This program was launched last spring and six applicants were matched to six volunteer mentors from different fields in Neuro-Oncology. The plan is for the mentee to conceive of a specific project and develop it in collaboration with the mentor, over the course of the year, the idea being that the skills for developing a project will be taught through this collaborative effort. The project could be anything from setting up as a lab experiment to writing a review paper, etc. The best project will be presented at the annual meeting.

A new call for mentees will follow this year.

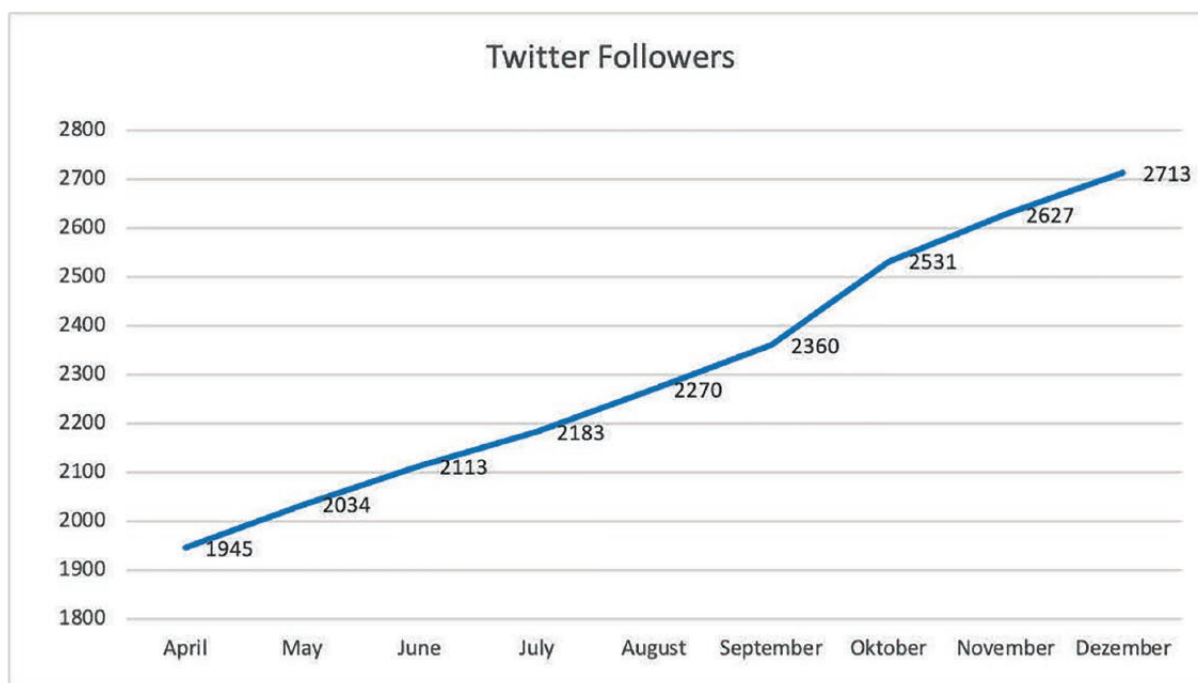
